Mayor Bruce Harrell Joined iUrban Teen's 2025 iCivics Summit to Empower Youth to Shape the Future of Public Service

The 2025 iCivics Summit, hosted by iUrban Teen at Seattle Central College, brought together students, parents, and civic professionals for a powerful day of hands-on learning and inspiration.



Workshops led by **King County Public Health, IT (GIS), Metro**, and the **City of Seattle's AI and Police Departments** introduced youth to real-world careers in civic tech and public service. Parents engaged in roundtable discussions with local government leaders and educators.

Mayor Bruce Harrell's keynote energized the crowd, followed by a dynamic **Career Panel** and **World Café** session led by iUrban Teen's **Keith Kloucek-Hummel**, where students shared ideas for a more connected, equitable future.

The Summit empowered young people to see themselves as innovators, change-makers, and future civic leaders.

February Black History Month Celebrating Art/Health/Film

Looking Back: Uplifting Our Community in 2025



In 2025, iUrban Teen deepened its commitment to community wellness, resilience, and connection. Through programs like our Black History Month Health & Wellness session, we provided youth and families with essential tools for mental and physical health. Dr. Gina Guillaume explored the root causes of toxic stress, highlighting how diet, exercise, environment, and systemic inequities impact well-being. Georgann Pierce guided participants through simple yet effective exercises to reduce stress and promote balance.

Selected key statistics on racial health disparities because of this work:

- Black or African American adults are diagnosed with hypertension about **26% more** frequently than the overall U.S. population.
- Black or African American individuals have a life expectancy of **74.0 years** compared to the U.S. average of about 78.4 years.
- Nearly **20% plus** of Black adults report their health as "fair or poor," significantly higher than the national average.

The event encouraged meaningful discussions, empowered participants to prioritize self-care, and underscored the importance of community support in navigating challenges. As we reflect on the year, iUrban Teen celebrates the connections made, the learning gained, and the positive change achieved—laying the groundwork for a stronger, healthier, and more resilient community in the years ahead.

Black History Month Celebrating Art/Health/Film

Looking Back: Black History Month – Energy & Engineering Impact



The Black History Month Energy & Engineering Event united key industry leaders — including BPA, PGE, Energy Trust, Maul Foster, Clark Public Works, Dream Team Recycling, Wise Eyes, and Innovation Lab — to collaborate on innovative solutions in the energy and engineering sectors.

Beyond exploring sustainability and technological advancements, the event centered on inspiring and educating youth about engineering careers. Students engaged with industry professionals, gaining insight into STEM pathways and the opportunities they offer for the next generation of engineers.

By the numbers:

- Black Americans represent only about **5% of all engineers and architects** in the U.S., despite constituting approximately 13% of the population.
- Among undergraduate engineering students, Black or African American students account for only around **3.2% of student engineers**.
- In recent years, bachelor's degrees in engineering awarded to Black students have hovered near **4.3% of total engineering bachelor's degrees**.



By fostering mentorship, hands-on learning, and partnership, the event highlighted the vital role of community collaboration in shaping a more sustainable, innovative future — and specifically, in opening more pathways for under-represented youth into engineering fields. We thank our partners, presenters, and attendees for their support and for helping empower the engineers of tomorrow.

April Future Ready Skills Day with Intel





Students explored the power of water at iUrban Teen's Hydro Challenge Workshop, enjoying a hands-on day full of energy, engineering, and imagination.




With guidance from three Electrical Engineering students from WSUV, participants delved into the science of hydro and wind power using STEM kits, a 3D printer, and interactive experiments.

Students built and tested water wheels that powered LED lights, created water-based circuits to run fans and lights, and constructed working windmills. They also designed their own 3D-printed objects, which are now in production and will be delivered to them soon.





iSports Dallas Wraps Up a Summer of Data and Discovery!



From July 21 to August 1, 2025, high school students participated in a two-week Sports Data Analytics program at Dallas College Cedar Valley, gaining hands-on experience in how data informs performance, strategy, and gamification in sports.

Through project-based learning, mentorship, and collaborative teamwork, students strengthened both technical and professional skills. The program culminated in final presentations where participants confidently analyzed complex datasets, articulated insights, and connected data findings to real-world sports applications—demonstrating measurable growth in communication, critical thinking, and self-efficacy. Students also received stipends exceeding \$100 in gift cards, recognizing their commitment and achievement.

This impactful learning experience was made possible through the generous support of The NBA Foundation, whose partnership continues to expand access to real-world technology opportunities for youth.

Future Makers: iEngineer

Inspiring the Next Generation of Innovators



"What does it really take to become an engineer?" That question guided iUrban Teen's Future Makers iEngineer event on August 13, 2025, at Clackamas Community College—one of our flagship programs for middle and high school students. Through a full day of hands-on workshops, mentorship, and real-world exposure, students explored engineering pathways across energy, robotics, transportation, environmental solutions, and advanced technologies.



Industry professionals led interactive sessions that brought engineering to life, helping students move beyond theory to experience what it truly means to design, build, and solve problems. A dynamic career panel featuring Michael Koch (Cascade Energy), Nashoni Whitlock (Advanced Technology Communications), Darryl Cole Sr. (ACT Enviro), and Shilpa Mallem (Interstate Bridge Replacement Program) offered authentic insight into career journeys, challenges, and opportunities—reinforcing that these futures are both attainable and inspiring.



The program welcomed a vibrant, diverse mix of students whose cultures, backgrounds, and perspectives reflected the strength of our community. By day's end, participants left with more than swag and raffle prizes—they gained confidence, motivation, and a clearer vision for their futures, with one student sharing, "Yes, I would recommend iUrban Teen events to a friend." iUrban University Celebrates First Graduates of Semiconductor Workforce Pathway Program

Portland, OR – September 19, 2025



iUrban University proudly celebrated the graduation of its first cohort from the **Semiconductor Workforce Pathway Program**, a groundbreaking initiative designed to prepare young adults for careers in one of the fastest-growing industries worldwide. Launched in August 2025, the free 5-week program equipped participants with technical knowledge, hands-on skills, and career readiness to pursue entry-level roles in semiconductor manufacturing. Graduates gained a strong foundation in semiconductor processes and received career coaching, financial literacy training, mentorship, and wraparound support, including transportation and childcare assistance. Each participant also earned a \$500 stipend while completing the program.

The program served young adults ages 18–30 who were eager to launch meaningful careers in a field central to global innovation—from smartphones to electric vehicles. The graduation celebration, held on September 18 at the PCC Willow Creek Opportunity Center, highlighted the achievements of the first cohort and announced two additional cohorts scheduled for October–December 2025 and March–May 2026 at the PCC 42nd Street Opportunity Center / NAMC.

"Today's graduates represent the future of technology and workforce innovation," said **Deena Pierott**, Founder of iUrban Teen and iUrban University. "This program was about more than skills—it was about building confidence, creating pathways, and showing our young people that they belong in high-demand industries like semiconductors."

The Semiconductor Workforce Pathway was made possible through the support of the **Higher Education Coordinating Commission**, in partnership with **Portland Community College, NAMC, and Platinum Construction**, ensuring that historically untapped communities had access to the careers of tomorrow.






November iSports Program Impact

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Breakfast on KOIN Morning Show: Everyday Northwest



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
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
